IV. Visa requirements

The Philippine Government strongly enforces immigration and entry laws. You should ensure you have proper and valid visas and remain aware of your visa status while in the Philippines. When preparing your visa request, be aware that:

- Immigration authorities may require proof of an onward or return ticket.
- Your passport must be valid for at least six (6) months beyond the date of entry into the Philippines.
- Application for visa needs to reach the Philippine embassy/consulate in time. We advise
 you to send your application to the embassy/ consulate at least two months before your
 entry to the Philippines.
- The government requires some travellers to present proof of yellow fever vaccination. Find more information in section *X health watch*.

Citizens of a number of countries do not need a visa to enter the Philippines. See a list of those countries in Annex 1. If you need a visa upon arrival (VUA) or waiver of visa, please contact APIRAS (apirasnetwork@hotmail.com) as soon as possible so APIRAS can make the necessary arrangements with the Philippine Department of Foreign Affairs and the Bureau of Immigration.

Most Philippine embassies and consulates process visas quickly. However, you must anticipate glitches along the way (such as problems with travel documentation). Provide at least one month lead time for visa application and processing.

V. Arrival and Transport to and from the Venue

APIRAS has arranged transport from the Ninoy Aquino International Airport (NAIA) to the Heritage Hotel from evening of 24 September until morning of 26 September. After you clear the Customs Area of the airport, proceed to the International Organisations' Desk located at the arrival lobby of Terminal 1 (left side near Duty Free and OWWA Desk). A representative from the International Rice Research Institute (IRRI) will assist you in paging the assigned driver.

If you prefer to take your own taxi, it will be approximately 10 USD

VI. Language and Culture

Filipino is the main language used in the Philippines with English as second language. Most locals speak proficient English.

Filipinos are known to be very friendly and hospitable people. Take the time to smile and say "thank you." You will receive an even better response if you throw in a little Tagalog, such as "salamat po", which means "thank you".

VII. Money

The Philippines' currency is the Peso. 1 USD = 42.00 PHP (as of 9 May 2012). Have your currencies changed in banks inside the international airport. Several banks are likewise found around the vicinity of the Hotel.

You can use your ATM cards to withdraw funds. The three major local ATM consortia in the Philippines are *BancNet*, *MegaLink* and *Expressnet*. International networks, like *PLUS* and *Cirrus*, are accessible with many ATMs, however Cirrus is more predominant than PLUS. ATMs are also located in the shopping malls.

Credit card holders can use VISA, MasterCard, American Express and JCB cards in many commercial locations in the Philippines.

VIII. Weather and Climate

The Philippines is a tropical country with two distinct seasons. From June to September, the country experiences a rainy season brought by the south-western monsoon. From October to February, the north-eastern monsoon brings cold winds creating cool and dry weather. In September you can expect the Metro Manila temperature to be 73-86°F / 23-31°C.

IX. Keep Safe!

While Filipinos are generally friendly and accommodating, Manila, like many other large cities in the world, has its own share of security problems, especially pickpocketing. For your own safety, you are advised to exercise a high degree of caution at all times.

- Do not flash your valuables (e.g. iPods and smart phones). Carry small change and don't flash large bills.
- Be especially cautious when out at night: Do not enter alleyways and remote areas.
- Women are especially advised to travel in groups.
- Ignore strangers accosting you outside the hotel or on the streets.
- Be careful when using credit cards.

While there are reported threats of terrorism in the Philippines, tourists in Manila are normally not at risk. The Philippine government has tightened security in Metro Manila and other areas, including airports and seaports.

Contact the Embassy or Consulate of the Philippines nearest you for the most up-to-date information.

X. Health Watch

Some actions will prevent you from falling ill:

- Drink only bottled water. Tap water is not considered safe for drinking.
- Manila is not a malaria area. No special prophylaxis is needed to attend the 3rd GFRAS Annual Meeting.
- Although yellow fever is not a risk in the Philippines, the government requires some travellers arriving from <u>countries with risk of yellow fever virus transmission</u> to present proof of yellow fever vaccination.
